CB Relationship Managers Report.

BHS report Appendix 1.

The Disciplinary Committee have started to hand partial suspended sentences in the hope that a "Sword of Damocles" effect will happen.
- 2. MJW questioned why clubs as a whole are not sanctioned for this behaviour. BHS 2 clubs have been sanctioned and are due to be heard.

Appendix 2

Mixed Ability Update

Lancashire have won a £14,500 Sport England Grant for mixed ability rugby in Lancashire.

Tryit Rugby have already delivered sessions to local community groups and have more booked in for after Christmas for Sedgley Park. We have got the backing of the club to start running sessions which is looking at being after Christmas. Sedgley have given free tickets to all groups too for people to go and watch the first team.

I have had a meeting with Aldwinians who would like sessions after Christmas, there plan is to add members to their already growing team, who currently train with the walking rugby. They would like to do it after Christmas that way its leading up to the 6 nations and then the mixed ability festival in May, location TBC but it will be on the 26th May. There was also talk about Aldwinians looking at starting a junior mixed ability team.

Bolton already have a team, I will be sending out an email to them over the next few days to see how we can work with them and see if they would like any sessions in the community to help grow their team. I think it would be great if we could do the bronze sponsor package for part of their new kit.

Preston agreed to hosting a mixed ability team, but since the initial contact with the chairman they haven't really engaged. I am next week for an event so will chase when I am there.

Now the sport England grant has come through I can carry on working alongside the clubs and get into more community clubs.
