We are delighted to be playing a "new team to us" in the Northern Section for the first match of the Competition this season. It is fair to say that Somerset and ourselves have not been regular opponents down the years. I note we met in the 1935 Final and I believe that there were regular pre season tours to the South West back in the day. It is in fact the third meeting of the two Counties at Fylde, the first in 1932 and the

second in 1937, its been a long wait for this the next encounter on the Lancashire coast, so it will be a great experience for both sets of players to play against different opposition and for supporters to watch different opposition for both counties.

The County Championship is the oldest competition in English Rugby starting in 1889 and there have been over 120 championships contested since then. The tournament may have gone through several formats and changes but to

every player who has ever pulled on a County shirt it has provided the chance to play representative Rugby against counties from all over the Country and often tour overseas. In short it is a fantastic opportunity for players and coaches to test themselves in a different competition and environment and remains to only chance outside the full England side for adult players to play representative rugby.

Today it is a very diverse competition. In this seasons Northern Group consisting of Somerset, Yorkshire and Lancashire the wider



squads consisted of players from 30 different clubs from levels 3-7. Where else could a player from Midsomer Norton get to play alongside a player from Taunton against lads from Rotherham and Heath. It is a unique and special competition and the amount of enthusiasm from the players, coaches and management at the end of long hard League is always fantastic to see. The pride that is felt by players when they are awarded ties, badges and caps at the post match dinner is testament to the special place the county championship still commands for these players.

It is desperately sad that it appears elements within the RFU seek to diminish the status of the competition through lack of funding and proper promotion of the event. True the final is still at Twickenham, but we should be grateful for that ?. Twickenham is ours, our "Big Clubhouse". The Game is administered through the Counties and without that volunteer army running things on a daily basis, the game would implode . We should take a long hard look at ourselves as a sport.



There is an obsession with the Premiership, no one has a clue what to do with the Championship. Yet the National Leagues run efficiently and are pretty well self governing, the County sides should go hand in glove with the leagues as the representative rugby arm of the process. Where is all the funding

then, where is the underpinning support. The RFU should be falling over themselves to support us. They call us "grassroot " the "community game" which is demeaning, and by the way, are Gloucester not a Community Club does Northampton not service the rugby community around Franklin's Gardens.

Todays players are all proud to represent Somerset and Lancashire, they will give their all for their county and none will receive any payment. It is literally the definition of playing for the love of the game, and the honour that representing Somerset and Lancashire gives to them. I think these virtues fall smack into the Core Values



that the RFU are so keen to promoteyes... you agree ? . So properly support it and make sure that it continues to be a massive part of the Rugby Landscape in the English Game .
